

# Palabras afirmativas y negativas

\* To make a sentence negative: put *no* before the verb.

\* However, there are other words which will make a sentence negative.

\* These words have antonyms which are indefinite, don't refer to anyone/anything specific.

Affirmative (indefinite) words	Negative words
algo = <i>something</i>	nada = <i>nothing</i>
alguien = <i>somebody</i>	nadie = <i>nobody</i>

## Ejemplos:

¿Van a comer algo? = *Are they going to eat anything?*

Nadie canta como ellos. = *Nobody sings like them.*

# Palabras afirmativas y negativas

- \* To make a sentence negative: put *no* before the verb.
- \* However, there are other words which will make a sentence negative.
- \* These words have antonyms which are indefinite, don't refer to anyone/anything specific.

Affirmative (indefinite) words	Negative words
siempre = <i>always</i>	nunca = <i>never</i>
a veces = <i>sometimes</i>	raras veces = <i>seldom</i>

## Ejemplos:

Siempre como en casa. = *I always eat at home.*

Nunca estudio en la biblioteca. = *I never study in the library.*

# Palabras afirmativas y negativas

\* In a negative sentence, some negative word always precedes the verb.

\*If NO precedes the verb, any other negative word follows the verb.

## Ejemplos:

No hay nadie en el  
parque. = *There is nobody in the park.*

**\*\*NOTE:** *Double negative is permissible!*

No vamos a comer  
nada. = *We aren't going to eat anything.*

No vamos a entrar  
nunca. = *We are never going to get in.*
